

Burgh Island privacy policy

We take the privacy of our customers and their information very seriously. This policy outlines how we use your data and how we protect you privacy.

We may collect information about our customers such as name, address, telephone numbers, job title, company, e-mail addresses, interests and hobbies etc. We also need to know all the names of guests who stay with us at. In some cases when booking we collect payment information including debit and credit cards. This payment data is not retained beyond the date of the stay booked.

We use contact information to manage the process of your booking. We also may use your information to send you updates we think might be of interest, special offers and news.

You may opt-out of receiving communication from Burgh Island at any time. To do so, please contact <u>reception@burghisland.com</u>. Please note that we will not pass your information onto any third party for the purpose of marketing.

When you make a booking on the Burgh Island website, we use secure server software that encrypts all information you input before it is sent to us. This ensures that the information you provide is reasonably protected against unauthorised interception.

In order to comply with the Data Protection Act of 1984 and 1998, we follow procedures in the storage and disclosure of information that you have given to us, to prevent unauthorised access, misuse, alteration or loss of information under our control. Our security measure may mean that we will require proof of identity before we are able to disclose information to you.

In providing personal information to Burgh Island, you consent to the collection and use of the information by Burgh Island in the ways described above.

We would like to remind you that you are legally entitled to access, modify, correct and delete any data we hold relating to you and that you have the legal right to forbid this data being prevented to any third parties. This helps us analyse data about webpage traffic and improve our website in order to tailor it to customer needs. We only use this information for statistical analysis purposes and then the data is removed from the system.

Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

We may from time to time change our privacy policy, if we do we will post these changes on our websites, so that you are always aware of what information we collect, how we use it and what circumstances we disclose it in.
